# Chapter 12

# **Administration Beliefs**

## Tables

In this chapter, the response to one survey question is examined to better understand respondents' perceptions of upper-level administrators' beliefs about the primary function of advising undergraduates. Respondents could select from three answer options to indicate their perceptions about administrator beliefs: facilitating student development, teaching and facilitating student learning, and assisting with course enrollment. They also could use an open response option to list an administration belief that was not an answer option on the survey. The answers provided to the open response option were comprised of three different combinations of the three provided answer options and were categorized as facilitating retention, persistence, and graduation.

Sample sizes with fewer than 50 respondents are marked with an \* (e.g.,  $n = 30^*$ ) for tables that present the number and percentage of respondents who endorsed a particular answer. A change in the answer of one respondent would change the degree of difference by more than 2%. Therefore, inferences involving these groups should be made cautiously.
